


PARTNERSHIP




Charles Brown

Before:

- Homeless 8 years
- Addicted to alcohol
- Untreated bipolar disorder

After:



- Placed in treatment facility
- Completed 120 days of a substance abuse program extending the required 90 days
- Has remained sober
- Found employment
- Shares a housing rental with his partner




Ronnie Brown

Before:

- Homeless 15 years
- Addicted to meth and marijuana for half of his life
- Untreated mental illnesses
- Extensive medical history and many criminal charges

After:



- Placed in permanent housing in his hometown of Barstow.
- Connected to a temporary shelter until he could get connected to substance abuse treatment services and permanent residency in Barstow

Delicia Smith



Before:

- Homeless 7 years
- Suffers from congestive heart failure and chronic pain
- Untreated bipolar disorder

After:




- Placed in Housing and Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP)
- HDAP provided motel assistance up to 90 days while client was connected to a permanent residency.
- HDAP also offered social security advocacy to assist in gaining SSI/SSDI benefits medical ailments
- Delicia attended training to receive her guard card in an effort to secure gainful employment.

HOMELESS ENCAMPMENTS

In 2022:

- 165 homeless encampments were cleared
- 52.5 tons of debris were removed






Point In Time Count


Unsheltered Population: City of Rialto

Unsheltered Population: Regional











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
