FILLING POTHOLES AND REPAVING ROADS

- Pavement preservation project on nearly 78 miles of US 101 from south of School Road to north of Big Lagoon Bridge near the City of Trinidad in Humboldt County
- Pavement preservation project on nearly 37 miles of US 101 from Englewood Park Undercrossing to Eel River Bridge near Redcrest in Humboldt County
- 31 projects rehabilitating local streets and roads in Siskiyou County
- Nearly 6 miles of pavement improvements on two-lane road on Lower Lake Road in the Fort Dick area in Del Norte County
- Pavement improvements on 25 miles on I-5 from the Sacramento River Bridge in the City of Dunsmuir to Black Butte Overhead in Siskiyou County

- Construct new bridge on US 101 near the Smith River community in Del Norte County
- Revamp 6 bridges on SR 3 and I-5 in Siskiyou County
- Replace the Dr. Fine Bridge on US 101 north of the Smith River Overflow Bridge north of Crescent City in Del Norte County

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

- BART extension into downtown San Jose and out to Santa Clara, creating 4 new stations. Will serve over 52,000 new riders per day in 2035 and increase connectivity to Caltrain, Amtrak, and transit services at San Jose Diridon station.
- 272 new BART rail vehicles, increase train frequency to 30 trains per hour through the Transbay tunnel, increase in train length to 10 car trains during peak hours to alleviate crowding. Allows for over 200,000 new daily BART riders.
- Service improvements for Caltrains to include the replacement of old diesel fleet with high-performance electric trains
- Deploy 45 zero-emission buses to expand fleet for the Alameda Contra Costa Transit District (AC Transit)
- 8 zero-emissions vehicles for Muni light rail system for the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA)
- Increased passenger rail trips on weekdays and weekends for Sonoma-Marin Area Rail Transit (SMART) District
- Add express bus routes along US 101 in San Mateo, Santa Clara, and San Francisco counties using 37 zero-emission vehicles to reduce travel times and improve reliability
- Secure 59 new 40-foot hybrid diesel-electric buses to replace existing diesel buses for the Alameda Contra Costa Transit District (AC Transit)
- Development and construction of a multi-modal transit center in the City of Ukiah

- Replace traffic signal equipment and lights throughout the City of Paradise
- Fix 18 culverts along SR 299 in Trinity County to reduce flooding on roads
- Safety improvements along SR 70 to include widening 2 lane highway to 5 lanes, creating a two-way left turn, improved traffic signal at Ophir Road and intersection at SR 70 and Palermo Road in Butte County. This corridor has seen higher than average collision rates attributed to the lack of passing lanes.
