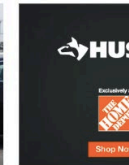

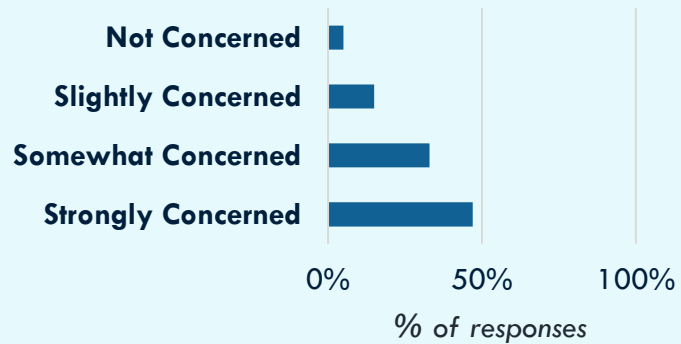

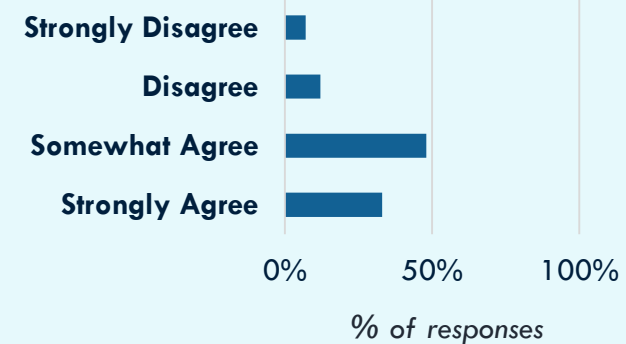

How concerned are you that the use of smart city technologies could mean less privacy for Long Beach residents?



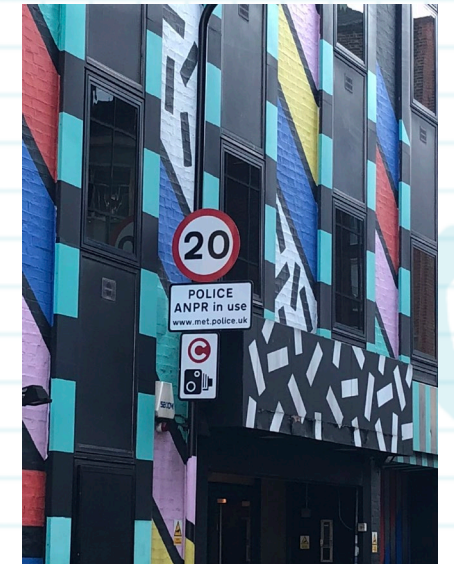
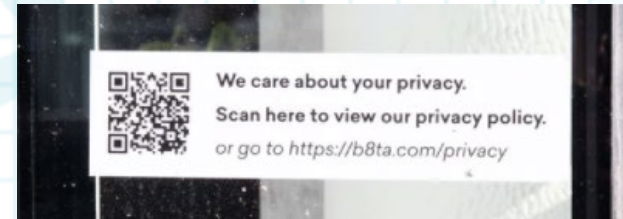

Digital Tech is Everywhere

Cities have a technology legibility problem

- Lack of **transparency** that prevents public from understanding the role of digital tech in cities.
- Lack of **accountability**, so the public cannot meaningfully engage in dialogue about the role of technology to improve quality of life.
- Cities are missing necessary tools to increase legibility of tech.



Solution: Digital Rights Platform

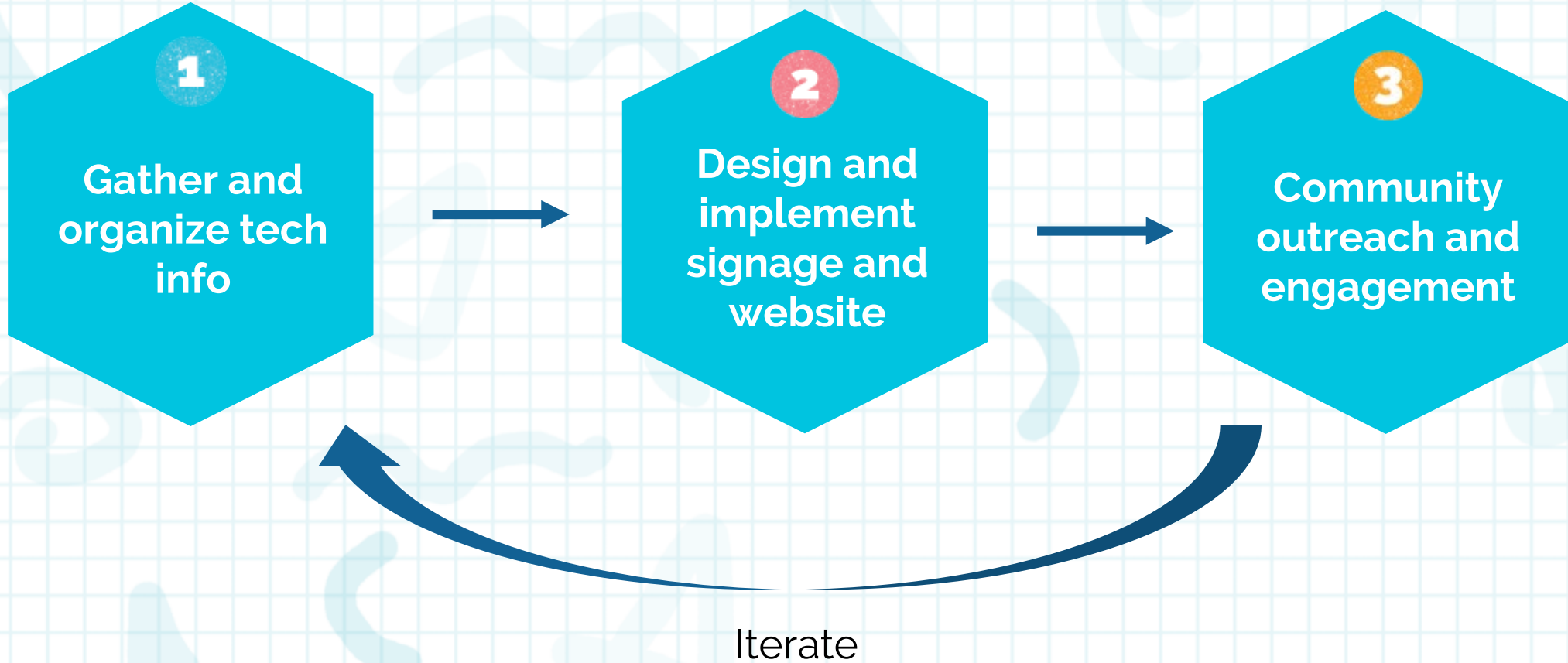
- **Signage** component: Signs deployed with tech to promote transparency and build trust, with a scannable code to easily link to online platform
- **Online** component: Displays additional information and a feedback channel

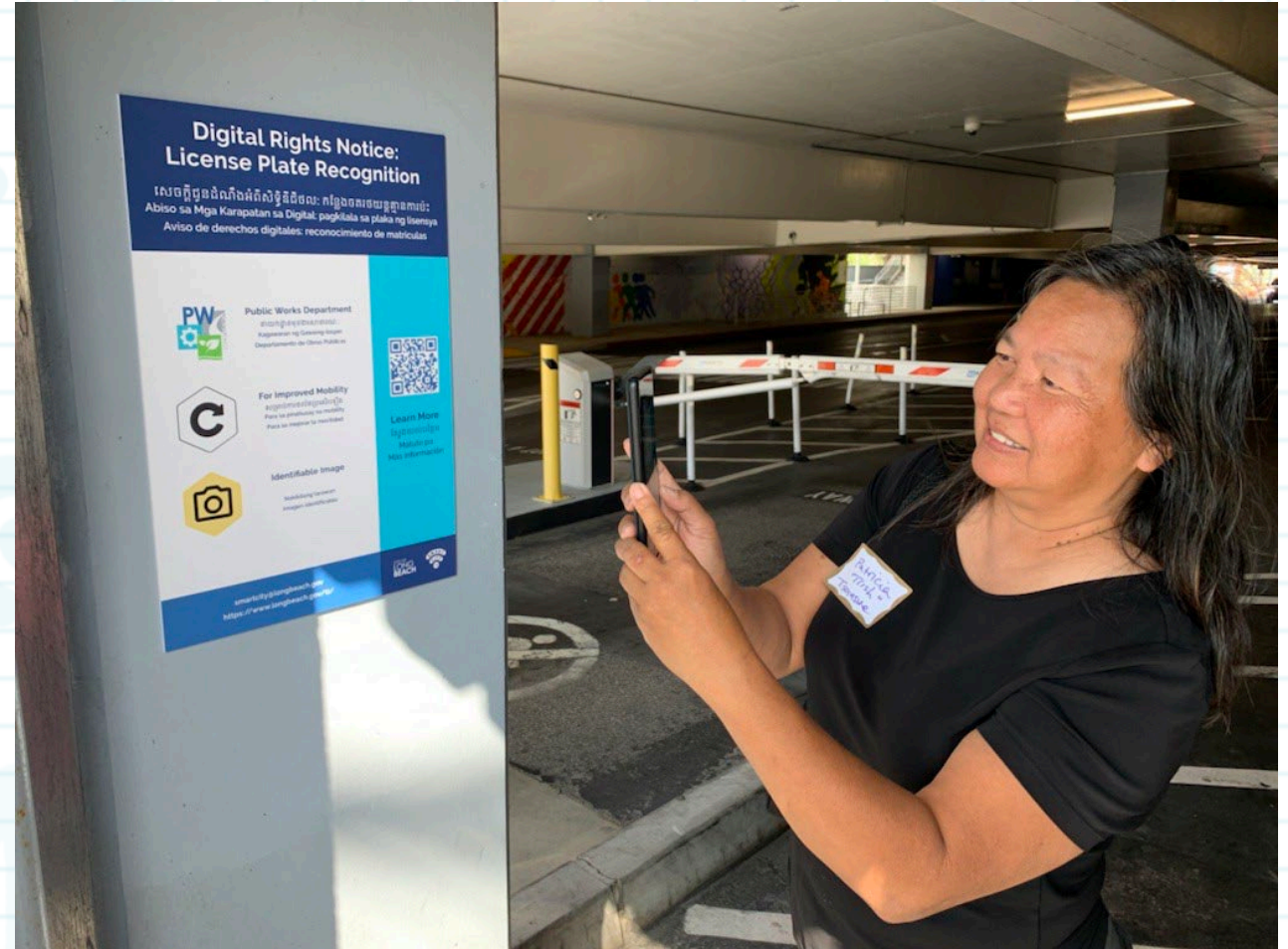

 - 115 survey responses
 - 10 interviews
 - 40 beta testers
 - 6 signs deployed for two City technologies
 - Digital Trust in Places and Routines (DTPR) taxonomy and icons
- **Context**, not just technology

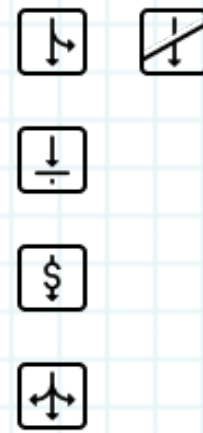

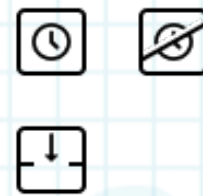

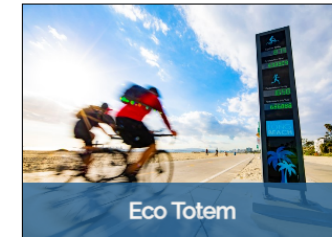

Solution: Digital Rights Platform

Platform increases tech literacy and advances learning

"We should focus on the [tech] that has the most relevant, salient impact in an individual's life."

Reduces fear and skepticism of technology

"I think it is good that the City wants to tell you they are using your data. Builds trust within the community."

Promotes deeper resident engagement

"It's not just a question of trust, it's a question of transparency, and it is only fair that the City let people know that it is happening."

What's Next

- **Build internal buy-in:** City tech 'owners' and 'communicators' to complete inventory.
- **Expand** digital rights platform to 3 more neighborhoods and 14 more technologies.
- Pursue alignment with other CA communities.
- Explore “opt out”
- **Shift the smart city paradigm** away from corporate-driven tech deployments to resident-driven.
