Placemaking: Chattanooga, TN

- Historically an industrial-based economy: smokestacks through 1970s
- Image problem, growth stalling
- Started with goal of being a great place to live
- 1980s: Vision 2000 initiative (aquarium, riverfront parks)
- Formed "The River City Company" non-profit organization to raise funds



Chattanooga, TN: Results

- 14% increase in population since 1990s
- Attracted Volkswagen Assembly Plant
 2,000 employees

- United States Department of Agriculture:
 Forest Service Landscape Scale Restoration
 Grants available from \$25,000 \$600,000
- The National Park Service:
 Land and Water Conservation Fund State and Local Assistance Program
 Grants available up to \$300,000
- Groundwork USA: Groundwork Trust
 Grants available up to \$190,000
- Environmental Protection Agency: Brownfields Cleanup Grant Grants available up to \$500,000

Federal Grants

- Land and Water Conservation Fund
 Grants available to most states, ranging from \$85,000-250,000
- Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program (ORLP)
 Grants available to most states, ranging from \$300,000-\$1,000,000
