





Home Sales Palm Springs




Palm Springs Single Family Homes - Median Price




Transit Occupancy Tax 1996-2019

Economic Disparity within the LGBT Community

1 in 4

More than 1 in 4 LGBT Adults (27% - or 2.2 million people) experienced a time in the last year when they didn't have enough money to feed themselves/their families compared to 17% of non-LGBT adults.

14%

14% of LGB adults reported running out of food for their families and didn't have enough money for more in the last 30 days.


More than 1 in 4 LGB adults aged 18-44 (27%) participated in SNAP compared to 20% of non-LGB adults in that same age range.


